Diary Of A Bird Watching Addict And Other Notes From Whareroa Farm Whareroa Guardians Community Trust

A bit of data crunching from the detailed table (25 walkthrough visits up to and including 06.04.21) ...

- As in April 2020, "only" 14 species sighted. Usually between 14 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020 was a big day with 23 species (on May 28, 2020 only 12 were sighted nature can be fickle...)
- 3 species have been seen at each walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Chaffinches and Grey Warblers have been off shopping during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group too, Silvereyes have not been seen twice)
- 12 species were sighted during at least 64% (16 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Sparrow, Thrush & Tui
- Most sighted (Top 7 in alphabetical order): Blackbird (208), Chaffinch (190), Fantail (153), Goldfinch (118), Silvereyes (213), Sparrow (117), Tui (187).
- Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (3, 3), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (3, 5), Redpoll (3, 7), Shining Cuckoo (2, 3), White Faced Heron (2, 3), Rock Pigeon (0, 0)

April 6, 2021

Helen Reports: Today (April 6) was back to summer - hot and windless!

However, it was a day of relative quiet on the bird front. For the first time ever, apart from two blackbirds, I saw no birds from the entrance to the yards! Most unusual.

From there it was very still and very quiet. However, in the end, the tuis won the day with most bird seen or heard - noted particularly at the Matai Bush.

Today's vocal prize would have to go to the magpie.

As always, I was delighted to see and hear the bellbird in the Dell in his usual spot in the old kanaka. Number of species today 14, birds seen or heard 65.

Heading back, I admired, and found very user-friendly, the lovely stepping stones across the stream. This definitely enhances the diversion to the kohekohe forest, now that the bridge is out of bounds. I noticed a few buds appearing on the kohekohe trees - I wonder how the flowering will be this year.

It's good to see the sheep munching away at the long grassy paddocks :-)
