## Walkthrough: 11.06.2021 Diary Of A Bird Watching Addict And Other Notes From Whareroa Farm Whareroa Guardians Community Trust

Helen reports...

Helen's latest Bird walk-through report from Friday, June 11, is posted here - not only about birds, but also about one of the less visited but very beautiful areas of bush on the Ramaroa Track!

Helen reports...

Tony (Ed: Helen's trusty side-kick) and I went for a leisurely amble today along the Ramaroa track and then through the wonderful 'secret forest' - a superb day, calm and sunny.

It was a good decision. Beautiful bird song all the way, especially in the 'forest' where the kohekohe were flowering (see photo attached).

Here were countless tuis and bellbirds giving a great recital and filling the canopy with their flapping wings and the odd squawk of territorial irritation.

My count will not be very inaccurate I fear! (16 species and 64 birds seen or heard)

The start of the day on the Ramaroa track found us counting many fantails, grey warblers and song thrush, and saw chaffinches with their deepening breeding plumage.

The fantails love to accompany us which is always fun, though we have to be careful not to step on them!

I have attached a couple of photos - the red toadstools are so pretty now, under the pines, and the kohekohe bridal veils are always an irresistible photo opportunity!

A bit of data crunching from the attached table (27 walkthrough visits up to and including 11.06.21)

• On June 11, 2021: 16 species & 64 birds recorded (seen or heard).

Usually between 14 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020 was a big day with 23 species, on May 28, 2020 only 12 were recorded

• 3 species have been seen during every walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Chaffinches and Grey Warblers have been off shopping during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group too, Silvereyes have not been seen twice)

• 12 species were sighted during at least 66% (18 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Sparrow, Thrush & Tui

• Most sighted / Top 7 in alphabetical order: Blackbird (217), Chaffinch (195), Fantail (173), Goldfinch (119), Silvereyes (221), Sparrow (121), Tui (205)

• Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (3, 3), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (3, 5), Redpoll (3, 7), Rock Pigeon (0, 0), Shining Cuckoo (2, 3), White Faced Heron (2, 3)
