## Bird Count Walkthrough October 20, 2021

Helen Reports...

Today seemed like a good day for counting birds in Whareroa. Rather a cold SE wind greeted us surprisingly, but there was plenty of activity.

The chaffinch took the prize for most bird seen (16), and the most remarkable sighting was of two shining cuckoos near the Hub! They flew off later toward the Ti Kouka track. Another shining cuckoo was heard in the Ramaroa area.

We also saw two pairs of paradise shelduck - one pair up near the pine trees in the first paddock beside the farm race and the other pair, possibly on a nest, in the wetland area beyond the Hub. I mention this because last month they were missing!

I think I saw two black swans in flight up near the Cairn - maybe from the dam. Afterwards it occurred to me that they may have been Canada Geese but I couldn't do a replay so am unsure (I haven't seen Canada Geese in Whareroa before).

It was very good to see 3 kereru today and hear bellbirds in the kohekohe forest.

As we left, at the car park, we were very pleased to see that the swallows have defied all odds and have a nest in the information shelter! Yay!!

I have sent a pic of the lemonwood (Tarata) in flower...





..... and also of the very busy hive activity enhancing the view beside the Matai bush.

Many thanks to those who keep the tracks mowed - they do a wonderful job. We keep marvelling at the fabulous growth of all the plantings - today especially up the Ti Kouka loop. So sheltered now!

A bit of data crunching from the attached table (30 walkthrough visits up to and including 20.10.21)

Usually between 14 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020, was a big day with 23 species, on May 28, 2020, only 12 were recorded

- On Sep 20, 2021: 18 species & 107 birds recorded (seen or heard).
- 3 species have been seen during every walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Chaffinches and Grey Warblers have not been seen once during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group too, Silvereyes have not been seen twice)
- 14 species were sighted during at least 63% (19 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Eastern Rosella, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Kereru, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Sparrow, Thrush & Tui
- Most sighted / Top 8 in alphabetical order: Blackbird (236), Chaffinch (221), Fantail (187), Goldfinch (123), Pukeko (130), Silvereyes (230), Sparrow (131), Tui (225)
- Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (3, 3), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (3, 5), Redpoll (3, 7), Rock Pigeon (0, 0), Shining Cuckoo (3, 6), White Faced Heron (2, 3)
