Bird Count Walkthrough April 11, 2022

Helen reports...



Rather a grey day and not much going on - except I did catch sight of Suzie (?) on the mower which seemed a very good idea. The picnic area is very much in need of a mow.

I headed off up the farm race herding a bunch of sheep up to the hub.

The stream (SE Whareroa) which crosses the path near the entrance to the Dell was the lowest I have ever seen.

Then I followed on into the Carex Valley.

Here there were many fantails and silvereyes. I watched 6 silvereyes all enjoying a bath in the stream, which was fun.

There was quite a bit of activity around the gums and beyond - tuis, bellbird, chaffinches and blackbirds.

I became diverted by the track on the western side of the valley - it was a track that Tony was always keen about and years ago we walked it from the Lookout. So I had a moment of nostalgia and climbed up to the top.

Not many birds in the bush on the way up but near the top there were plenty of blackbirds, silvereyes and goldfinches. But I didn't include them in my count - it could have been because I was out of breathe!

I was rewarded by a great view of Mt Wainui and down into Whareroa with patches of planting areas on the top of the hills.

So my numbers were down a bit today, 14 species seen and 58 counted. A good day out though - and very energetic!

A bit of data crunching from the attached table (34 walkthrough visits up to and including 11.4.22)

Usually between 14 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020 was a big day with 23 species, on May 28, 2020, only 12 were recorded.

Helen records on average, a total number of 80 birds per walkthrough (the average has ranged from 54 to 130).

- On April 11, 22: 14 species & 58 birds recorded (seen or heard).
- 3 species have been seen during every walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Grey Warblers have not been seen once during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group too, Silvereyes & Chaffinches have not been seen twice)
- 15 species were sighted during at least 62% (21 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Eastern Rosella, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Kereru, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Sparrow, Starling, Thrush & Tui
- Most sighted / Top 8 in alphabetical order: Blackbird (262), Chaffinch (243), Fantail (211), Goldfinch (153), Pukeko (160), Silvereyes (257), Starling (145), Tui (265)
- Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (3, 3), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (3, 5), Redpoll (3, 7), Rock Pigeon (0, 0), Shining Cuckoo (4, 7), White Faced Heron (2, 3)
