Bird Count Walkthrough July 14, 2022

Helen reports...

Today was a spur of the moment short walk to check on the Titoki tree that we planted for Tony a couple of weeks ago. Of course, I had to do some bird obs at the same time.

We've had some terrible stormy weather lately with strong SE gales and I wanted to make sure our little tree was still upright. It was, I am glad to say, and was looking very happy on the edge of the Ti Kouka grasslands.

So, my numbers of birds were down: 12 species and 37 counted.

It was very calm and quiet with a sprinkling of rain in the hills.





Noticeable absence of tui today - heard only one in the kohekohe forest on my way out.

The song thrush was prevalent, the blackbirds also, and of course, our favourite piwakawakas - so loyal as usual.

Everything so lush and greenand wet! The streams full to the brim.

I entered the farm via what I call the Toetoe Flats - a well-trodden path, now a good access route. There has been some gorse busting and track building here which was good to see.

Nice steps - thank you to those hard-working volunteers.

The culvert building gang was hard at it. The concrete culvert sections look enormous! There were several cars in the car park - visitors undeterred by the earthworks.

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Data Table – some analysis

A bit of data crunching from the attached table (37 walkthrough visits up to and including 14.7.22)

Usually between 12 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020 was a big day with 23 species, on May 28, 2020, May 23, 2022 & July 14, 2022 only 12 were recorded.

Helen records on average, a total number of 80 birds per walkthrough (the average has ranged from 37 to 130).

- On July 14, 2022: 12 species & 37 birds recorded (seen or heard).
- 3 species have been recorded during every walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Grey Warblers
 have not been seen once during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group
 too)
- 14 species were sighted/heard during at least 61% (22 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Eastern Rosella, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Sparrow, Starling, Thrush & Tui (falling out of the list this time are: kereru with 21 sightings, back in are Starling with 22)
- Most recorded / Top 8 in alphabetical order: Blackbird (289), Chaffinch (248), Fantail (245),
 Goldfinch (172), Pukeko (178), Silvereyes (285), Starling (188), Tui (288)
- Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (3, 3), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (4, 7), Redpoll (3, 7), Rock Pigeon (0, 0), Shining Cuckoo (4, 7), White Faced Heron (2, 3)
