Bird Count Walkthrough January 29, 2024

Well, I finally made it into the farm after almost 4 months.

It was a slow meander along the 'straight and narrow' and great to be back in there again.

There was a strong and gusty southerly blowing which made hearing a bit difficult, so numbers are a bit down, but I recorded 16 species and about 54 birds all up.

<u>California Quail</u> were at the entrance but, apart from <u>blackbirds</u> and <u>starlings</u>, very little else.

In fact, \underline{tui} didn't make themselves heard until I reached the 'Gums', and near the 'Dell'.

I expect they were in Carex Valley enjoying the flax.

Lots of `twittering` goldfinches to be heard here too.



There were several 'old men rams' sleeping in the sun and not doing much lawn mowing.

Other things to mention were the fabulous kahikiteas and carex in the small stream on the left of the track to the 'Dell' and the new steps being made in the 'Dell'. That will be great.

The ribbonwood near the caravan was decked out with impressive bunches of flowers/seedheads (not sure which!)

Data Table – some analysis

.

A bit of data crunching from the attached table (51 walkthrough visits up to and including 29.01.24)

Usually between 12 and 20 species have been sighted during most walk-throughs. September 12, 2020, was a big day with 23 species, on May 28, 2020, May 23, 2022 & July 14, 2022 only 12 were recorded.

In approximately 2 hours, Helen records on average, a total number of around 80 birds per walkthrough (the range is 37 to 132).

- On January 29, 24: 16 species & 54 birds recorded (seen or heard).
- 3 species have been recorded during every walk-through: Blackbird, Tui & Fantail (Grey Warblers have not been recorded twice during separate visits, otherwise they would be in this exclusive group too)
- 13 species were sighted/heard during at least 65% (33 or more) of visits: Bellbird, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Eastern Rosella, Fantail, Grey Warbler, Magpie, Paradise Shelduck, Pukeko, Silvereye, Starling, Thrush & Tui
- Most recorded / Top 6 in alphabetical order: Blackbird, Chaffinch, Fantail, Grey warbler, Pukeko, Silvereye, Tui (plus starling but only as a large flock was spotted on 4.10.23)
- Least sighted in this series of reports (in alphabetical order, how often sighted, total number): Dunnock (4, 5), Falcon (2, 3), Mallard (5, 9), Redpoll (3, 7), Rock Pigeon (0, 0), Shining Cuckoo (6, 15), White Faced Heron (2, 3)
